Program Requirements

We all know experience is the best teacher. That is why the American Humanics Program focuses on providing hands-on opportunities, such as internships and co-curricular activities, as well as coursework. Smaller classes, interaction with faculty, and individualized advisement make American Humanics a personalized educational experience. The following courses, (thirty credit hours, including a twelve-credit-hour internship), are required for American Humanics certification:

- NLM 220 Introduction to Nonprofit Organizations
- NLM 300 Fund Raising and Resource Development
- NLM 310 Volunteer Management
- NLM 320 Professional Development Seminar
(students repeat this course at least four semesters)
- NLM 420 American Humanics Institute (requires out-of-state conference)
- NLM 430 Managing Nonprofit Organizations
- NLM 463 Senior Internship

The American Humanics program, with the help of our American Humanics partners, also includes an array of on-the-job and student association activities that provide opportunities for students to develop and strengthen their knowledge, skills, leadership abilities, and understanding of the nonprofit sector.
