



Introduction

The School of Community Resources and Development (SCRD) is one of four degree-granting units in the Watts College of Public Service and Community Solutions at the Downtown Phoenix campus. The school works towards contributing to healthy, resilient and sustainable communities and is one of ASU's transdisciplinary schools encompassing faculty in several areas of study. Our foundation discipline is community development with specific areas of education and scholarship that rest on this foundation: nonprofit leadership and management, parks, recreation and sports management, and tourism development and management.

School faculty and students engage in a broad range of research endeavors that emphasize transdisciplinary and a systems approach to sustainable community development. Translation of research to practice is partly advanced through the three centers affiliated with the school: the Lodestar Center for Philanthropy and Nonprofit Innovation; the Center for Sustainable Tourism (CST); and the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI).

The activities of the SCRD faculty, staff and students exemplify the design aspirations of the New American University through our programs' unifying principle of contributing to healthy, resilient and sustainable communities. 
